Registration is June 3 - 28 in your home school district.

About Virtual Regional Summer School

- Students who require a laptop or any other type of technical assistance, should contact their home school administrator.
- Attendance is required on a daily basis. Students are required to log in on time for each of their required courses and participate for the full hour (for credit recovery) or 2 hours and 15 minutes (for advanced credit).
- Students are required to make up missed classes.
 Make-up date will be held August 16.
- Failure to make up the corresponding number of missed classes from any course may result in a failure of that course.
- Four missed classes may result in removal from that class.
- Students will be contacted by their home school counselor regarding the need to attend Virtual Regional Summer School.
- After students have been registered, they will receive an email from HFM BOCES Virtual Regional Summer School staff regarding course schedules and other pertinent information. Students should check their email for information.

Why does HFM BOCES offer a regional summer school?

In an effort to consolidate services and provide more cost-effective programs, HFM BOCES is again offering a regional summer school to area high school students.

What are summer school dates/ times?

Virtual summer school begins on Monday, July 15 and runs through Thursday, August 15. Classes are not held on Fridays. Make-up date for missed classes will be held August 16.

Classes for **Credit Recovery** (full-year courses previously taken and failed) will be offered during three periods:

- First period: 9 -10 a.m.
- Second period: 10:10 -11:10 a.m.
- Third period: 11:20 -12:20 p.m.

Classes for **Advanced Credit** (Economics, Participation in Government and Health only) will be offered during two periods:

- First period: 8:45-11 a.m.
- Second period: 11:15 a.m. -1:30 p.m.

How do students register?

Students from participating schools may register in their home districts June 3 - June 28.

Who can participate?

Students in grades 9-12 from the participating school districts may register for Virtual Regional Summer School.

Are there eligibility requirements for summer school?

Parents should check with their home school district for attendance and grade eligibility requirements.

What is the attendance policy for Virtual Regional Summer School?

No more than three absences are allowed and all missed classes must be made up during the make-up date of August 16. More than three absences may result in removal from the course. Attendance consists of logging in on time and participating in assigned courses each day.

Is there a Code of Conduct for Regional Summer School?

Students must adhere to the Code of Conduct of their home school district.

Who will pay for a student to attend regional summer school?

Participating school districts pay for their students to attend regional summer school.

When are the summer Regents exams?

The Regents exams are scheduled for Monday, August 19 and Tuesday, August 20.
